La Mesa men injured in plane crash Sunday

Two La Mesa men escaped with minor injuries Sunday, July 6 when the small plane they were flying aparently lost power and crashed just off Skyline Drive near Big Dens Lake

Charles Brunkow, the pilot and owner of the 2-seater Tri-Pacer, and Lawrence McArron, his passenger, were flown by Sheriff's helicopter to Loma Linda Hospital and treated for minor cuts and bruises. Both were said to be in their 50s.

Sheriff's deputy Gary Penrod said the white and orange craft apparently lost power, clipped two small pine trees, and crashed

about 50 feet below the ridge of Skyline Drive. The plane was demolished.

The craft was headed northwest when the accident occurred about 2:30 p.m. and apparently had just taken off from Big Bear City Amport. Another pilot flying in the vicinity saw the plane go down and notified authorities.
